The American Legion launches *We Were There* public service campaign

New public service announcement evokes pride in values, mission and history of the organization

INDIANAPOLIS (September TBD, 2019) — The American Legion is launching a new public service campaign that highlights the steadfast values that serve as a foundation for the organization: patriotism, a strong national security, support for all veterans and a strong desire to turn today's youth into tomorrow's leaders. The new *We Were There* public service announcement (PSA) uses historic and current imagery to highlight Legionnaires in action and shows the impact of hundreds of American Legion programs and activities that strengthen the nation.

"For more than a century, Legionnaires have been making a positive difference for veterans and their communities," said James W. "Bill" Oxford, national commander of The American Legion. "We provide flag education in schools, raise scholarship funds for youth and help organize relief efforts during a natural disaster. We are veterans who continue to serve our country."

Legionnaires and local posts can be found in nearly every community in America providing veterans and their families with a variety of programs and services including benefits claims support, career and education assistance, and temporary and emergency financial aid. The American Legion provides youth programs that support learning, as well as educate them about citizenship, teamwork and leadership.
